Martin Luther and the Reformation

2017 marks the 500th anniversary of the year Martin Luther made his 95 Theses known to the world, thus changing the history of the church, country, and world forever.

I recently bought a book at one of our church garage sales entitled "Luther for the Busy Man." Obviously this appealed to me because of the connotation that if I bought the book, I would appear to enter the ranks of "busy men."

The book is by author/translator Dr Paul David Pahl who served as a lecturer at Concordia Seminary in Adelaide from 1942 to 1966. The fly leaf says "He has faithfully reproduced Luther's words in clear, robust translation."

In reading some of the passages in the book I was impressed with how down to earth Luther's writings were and how they managed to span the gap of almost 500 years since the time they were written.

We have a wonderful legacy in the writings of the many who followed the biblical authors, throughout the ages until now. The fact that these writings have been preserved for others to study and learn from, appears to me to be something to marvel at and appreciate.

This is recognised in our Uniting Church Basis of Union, which in acknowledges the contribution of Reformation witnesses and scholarly interpreters of scripture."

In another arena, we may still sing Hymns written by authors from several centuries ago or even further if we indulge in the use of the "old hymn books" from time to time.

For example writers like St Stephen the Sabaite 725 – 794 and Bianca da Siena who died in 1434.

As well as appreciating these writings in their context, to me, the challenge seems to be to appreciate the messages they bring in our day and age.



Paul reminds us in his letter to the Colossians: "May you be filled with joy, always thanking the Father, who has enabled you to share the inheritance that belongs to God's holy people, who live in the light."

We need to be thankful for the writers of old and build on their legacy. Also, perhaps we need to be vigilant that some of our present day electronic writings of value, are not lost in the future, when technology moves us on to another form of recording our faith and beliefs.

Opening of the Church on a Regular Basis

It is desired to form a working committee (or Task Group if you like) to give serious thought to how we might be able to open up our building to the Community on a routine regular basis. Please let Tony Boulton know if you would like to be involved in this process as we would really like to include those who are not otherwise involved in ongoing leadership activities at present.

Following two preliminary proposal documents presented, Church Council at its July meeting gave approval in principal to formation of a group to prepare a formal proposal and recommendations to Council for the routine supervised opening for Community Use of the Sanctuary, Foyer and Chapel for Prayer, Meditation and Study (including use of media).

Your prayers, discussion (particularly in Study Groups) and advice reported back would help in further defining the concepts for later Council consideration.

Some "Leadership" activities, which might include Alpha studies for example or other service options such as the current Opportunity Shop options being considered could be included as a part of any proposal.

There might also be opportunity to liaise with other groups using the buildings to provide, through personal invitation, opportunity to participate in these various activities; including of course, Worship.

It is hoped that at least a preliminary proposal, including any implementation plan, could be brought to the September meeting of Council with a view to an early implementation date during our 2017 Spring. 
